How To Update PowerShell Help Files.

Problem: When you are trying to figure out how a specific command works in PowerShell and you don't think the "Help File" has everything in it, or has errors. Then you can look at the solution below on what command you will need to run to fix this.

<u>Solution</u>: The first thing that you will need to do is make sure that you are in fact connected to the internet as the command will not work correctly if you are not. Now you will need to Right-Click on the PowerShell, Shell and click on "Run As Administrator". Now type the following command without the quotes "update-help" then press the "Enter Key". The command will run and take several minutes to complete. Once it is finished you will be returned to a normal prompt. This is all you need to do in order to update you help files. Note: It is recommended (Especially if you use PowerShell a lot) to run this command at least once a month. When you run this command it pulls down any new help files that Microsoft has added or any changes that they have made to existing help files.
